A NEW PROGRAM FOR SOBC NANAIMO--Active Start:

The Active Start program is a new sport initiatives developed by Special Olympics BC (SOBC) to develop basic motor/sport skills through fun and positive movement experiences for children with intellectual disabilities.

Since 1980, SOBC has been a progressive sport organization providing sport training and competition for individuals with intellectual disabilities. This youth initiative grows from understanding the importance of sport and movement activities for children too young to participate in competitive sport programs.

Great success of Active Start rests on parents/caregiver participation. The programs strive to educate all involved in order to foster lifelong skill development for athletes.

Active Start is a family-centered activity program targeting young children with intellectual disabilities throughout BC between the ages of 2-6 years.

The Active Start program has many benefits:

- Substantial and improved development of physical, cognitive, and social abilities;
- Introduction of positive social experiences through appropriate play activities;
- Education for parents/caregivers in areas including nutrition, basic motor skills, and the Special Olympics organization.
- Opportunities for parents/caregivers to expand their networks and support systems. Active Start is facilitated by trained coaches.
